Katepwa 2013 Flood Prep-Council Update

Since March 11, 2013, Councillor Dwight Fisher, Administrator Glenda Hodson and EMO Consultant Warren Bobbee have arranged the following:

Sandbagger Machine has arrived- setup at East Maples, Agitator/vibrator was missing. Parts have now arrived and will be installed this week.

Container has arrived. Set up at East Maples. Supplies will be kept in the container and is locked.

Sand bags- have arrived (250,000) sent from Minnipolis. 150,000 dispersed to Bsaytah, Fort San, RM of North QuAppelle, Fort Quappelle, Lipton, and Balcarras. Katepwa has 100,000 in the container. Some have been handed out to residents so they can start filling sandbags by hand. A register (at the District of Katepwa office) is being kept so we know who has received sandbags. More sandbag are available.

Sand was delivered (approximately 15 truckloads) to Lakeside, Sandy Beach and East Maples, ahead of the Road Restriction to allow residents to start filling sandbags by hand.

Resident area meetings have been occurring at Sandy Beach, West Maples, and Lakeside, and some parts of East Maples. Many individual phone calls have been fielded to assist and provide direction on what options residents have.

Media-Very positive news coverage and interviews have occurred at Katepwa, since end of February, 2013, on the Flood Pre Planning and sharing of best practices to the surrounding towns, villages and RM's.

Communication was started in February, 2013, by using a Facebook Web page, which was reaching thousands of people , residents and also friends, who in turn passed on the information that was provided to their friends...so an excellent way to get information out quickly . Also this is where we will probably get the younger volunteers to hopefully do the labour intensive filling of the bags..etc,The Katepwa Web Page was also recently started up to also augment the communication and have a permanent copy of what is happening on a daily basis. Also a great resource.

The Emergency Response Equipment Fund- Fundraiser, was kicked off in late March, 2013, and was communicated out by hard copy letter (went out with the Tax Assessments), also on the Katepwa Facebook page, as a fund "thermometer" was placed to show how the funds are coming in, and also on the Katewpa Web Page, as Glenda Hodson, arranged for a PAYPAL system to be added, and also a official Tax Receipt provided to any donation given. To date we have received...\$ 12,870 to the fund, SO SPREAD THE WORD)...our Project goal is \$50,000, and our immediate expense is approximately \$33,000.

The Water Security Agency, (WSA) raised the water prediction on April 8, 2013, to 479.5 (2011 peak was 479.59), which is about 3-4 inches lower than 2011 levels.

The **Katepwa weir was opened on April 5...**and the lake level was 478.23. The lake level went down very rapidly and was **closed on April 12, 2013**, as the lake level dropped to 477.9. WSA was concerned that water well in the area could become an issue, like they were in 2011. Therefor the weir was closed to allow levels to come up. Also, want the Indian Head stream to run and not enter into Katepwa Lake. WSA is planning again to open the weir...once the Indian Head run off is just about through.

The weather has been unbelievable in the amount of snow, and the cold weather that is hanging on. This makes it very difficult to plan any form of deployment of sandbags or even to get ready for waterberms.

Communication has been sent out numerous times to the residents to remove snow from the shorelines, in areas where sandbags or water berms are required, and remove debris.

At Sandy beach, south shore, the drifts were about 3-4 ft high on the lakefront. Residents have hired a payloader, this past weekend, to open up the shoreline. This will allow the sun to thaw out the area.

At the Maples, snowblowers and bobcats have been utilized to clear the shoreline and property fronts. At West Maples, the snow drift were 5 and half feet high....in a few areas...so extremely hard to remove as the sun doesn't see this area.... As of Sunday, there were 4 or 5 properties still needing a considerable amount of snow removal

At Lakeside, Snow removal was completed about 3 weeks ago, and residents are already filling sandbags and opening culverts in preparation of the flow of water to come from the hills first. There next task is to prepare for the rise of water from the lake front.

Our Emergency Plan is still in the District Office getting some last minute touches and the District's additional information to add. It is ready to be used...in the shape it is in.

A Draft EOC Organization Chart is completed and will be finalized once we get closer to the event.

The various committees have been meeting:

Communication and Food Prep Committee- Eileen Fisher, Ann Meyer, and Eldeen Boehmer, have had a variety of discussions and keep in contact with Glenda and Warren. We advised we would give them a good weeks notice, of any plans we have that will affect them.

Equipment/Material group, Meetings and phone calls have occurred with Corey Hodson and Lorne Bennett, in preparing for needed equipment, material, 6 mill poly, pallets, radios, pump crews (to check pumps), opening culverts, ditches, opening up the road to the pit, opening up the area at Sandy Beach, across from the boat launch, and opening up the area at east maples, for the sandbagger operation. There is a considerable amount of work required in the near future. More meetings will occur in the next few days. Big thanks to Lorne Bennett for obtaining some great quotes on the polu and also picking up a load of pallets. We need a lot more pallets. Incident Command Trailer is set up as well.

EOC group....key individual members have been contacted on their availability...this will be monitored...as the Peak is constantly changing...and people of jobs and and a Life...I have heard.

I am pleased to say we are ready for the event relating to the Set up, Forecasting, Contact with our Mutual Aid neighbours, and Provincial Agencies. We have Equipment and Material, (planned and ready for deployment) and have a formal process to do the normal EOC Decisions. What is out of our control is who shows up on Game Day. We will only be as successful as what residents and volunteers assist. Council has done everything possible and more to prepare for this event, and Katepwa is being applauded (by the provincial government) for their foresight and early preplanning and sharing our history and EMO processes.

On April 13, 2013, Glenda Hodson and Warren Bobbee, attended the WSA meeting at Fort Qu'Appelle, which provided information on:

- the 2013 WSA Emergency Flood Reduction Program, on what was covered and what the process will be for the District and for the residents. Glenda will be providing the process to the residents
- a variety of historical water flow maps and , showing the floods of 1974 and 1976..
- who our contact representative is with WSA (Pat Johnson).

From our discussions with WSA and with Environment Canada...our best guess is:

Our peak (for Katepwa) will be around May 13-15, 2013, as long as we don't get significant rainfall. Echo is tentatively May 8, 2013.

Temperature are going to stay cool for awhile.

Our Plan, as of April 15, 2013

- 1. Open Road to Gravel Pit
- 2. Open Area at Sandy Beach, across from boat launch
- 3. Obtain more pallets, to be brought to Sandy Beach
- 4. Glenda Hodson to request/ obtain Permit from Highways to allow Gravel to be hauled, (probably between Midnight and 11 am). We require about 700 yds at Sandy Beach and probably about the same at East Maples....Note: we used 1800 yds in 2011.
- 5. Corey to start hauling, as soon as we have approval.
- 6. Install Vibrator on SandBagger
- 7. Set up Sandbagger site and start machine to get bugs worked out. Don Dejong and maybe Terry Hodson to assist
- 8. Allow machine to be running at East Maples, starting on April 20...if we obtain more gravel. We have 7 loads there, that wont last long. Start making sandbags and store on pallets. Need volunteers
- 9. Move Sandbagger Machine to Sandy Beach on April 25, and set up area. SandyBeach South shore have arranged for 30-40 people to assist with their build on April 27 and 28. Don Dejong and Tyler Bobbee to run the equipment and look after the machine to ensure it is looked after...plus instructions and supervision, Hard hats will be provided for anyone working at the chutes, due to the moving of equipment (OHS Regulations and great due diligence)...we are hoping to obtain safety glasses (as a donation), as well.
- 10. Move Sand Bagger back to East Maples on April 29 or 30, depending on Sandy Beach West Shores needs and volume.
- 11. Set up Incident Command Trailer/ Food Coordination Center, at East Maples.

- 12. Pump team hopefully in place to check pumps and assisting residents on instructions on setting up waterberms.
- 13. All this Communicated...as the process goes on. This is all subject to change...based on the fact that if we cant get a Restriction Permit for highway #56...then we may have to do all the work at East Maples... and trailer Material to Sandy Beach.
- 14. Glenda Hodson and Warren Bobbee will start to attend Meetings, effective April 18,13, at Fort QuAppelle, to update our mutual aid neighbours and obtain new information from the Province. These will be weekly meetings, until we declare a Local State of Emergency.
